You will recall we have been discussing the widening of Pine Street for years.

We have shared the concern with the residents in the 1000 block that the widening and subsequent relocation of the power poles will have a deleterious effect on their residences.

We have finally been given a direction from ArDOT on how to provide some relief. At our request, ArDOT will consider reducing the 2' green space from the plan to improve the distance from the homes/church to the road. ArDOT is also considering the reduction of their right-of-way by 12" which should move the power poles another foot closer to the road.

Although not monumental, it will provide some relief for these residents while still allowing for the transportation infrastructure we need.

Approval to Amend Budget and Repair Sewer Line

Over the past year staff has been replacing the main sewer line from the South lift station (on the east side of town) to the sewer ponds. This addresses a long-term nuisance and is part of the Capital Improvement program. The work to date has been done in-house using the open cut process, digging a ditch and replacing the pipe.

We have reached an area that will require a more technical approach. To traverse the high-pressure gas lines, it is in our best interest to have a company bore under these lines and connect with the work we have done on either side.

Staff had 3 bidders review the project and 2 pulled out due to the technical difficulties working in and around the high-pressure gas lines.

The qualified bidder supplying a bid is Jenkins Gravel & Construction from Glenwood. Staff is familiar with his work and comfortable working with Mr. Jenkins.

To accomplish this project, staff request you: 1. approve the use of undesignated funds to amend the 2021 Sewer Budget: Contract Services Category by increasing it by \$46,300 to cover the boring and pipe and 2. approve the quoted from Jenkins Gravel & Construction from October 4 in the amount \$46,287.
