- Spent time planning with engineers for future needs

• Water 6 – Install 6,200 feet of 12" water line on Malone Drive

- Will help increase water volume with potential growth in area

- Needed reserves exceed current rates ability to fund

Airport - 2021

Hangar Project completed in late April 2021

o Used as aircraft maintenance/avionics shop o 5-year lease with tenant began in June 2021

Airport Improvement Program project underway for taxiways/parking ramp

o Design ONLY

- o Estimate project cost \$124,000
- o 90/10 grant with Federal Aviation Administration, Arkansas Department of Aeronautics



Airport – 2022

- Planning phase for new Airport Terminal Building
- Estimated cost for 1,540 square foot building

o Local contribution - \$100,000





Aquatic Park – 2021

Installed new play structure

o Add "wow factor" o Increased patron engagement o Project cost - \$205,000





Aquatic Park - 2022

Continue maintenance repairs -\$75,000

o Recoat interior pool o Replace interior pool lights o Replace overhead pool lights o Refresh locker/bathrooms

• Refurbish Pool Slides \$50,000



Parks & Recreation – 2021

- Installed new turf field at Feaster Park
 - o Multi-use capability
- Revitalized Feaster #3 infield • Now has usable conditions
- Installed outdoor lighting for Outdoor Basketball Court





Parks & Recreation – 2022

- Construct new bathroom, concession facility (2021) - \$200,000
- Add an additional turf infield -\$400,000
- Create a new miniature golf course -\$400,000
- Establish new kayak launch
 - o Being researched







Police Department-2022

- Purchase final 4 vehicles
 - o\$140,000

• 50% participation in Cell Tower °\$150,000



Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP)

• PSAP = Dispatchers

ACT 660 Public Safety Act of 2019

- Requires the 225 PSAPS be reduced to 79 by 2023
- Next Generation 911 System to Arkansas

Two in Clark County

o Clark County Sheriff's Department o Arkadelphia Police Department

Baptist Health takes transfers, dispatches

o Will continue due to HIPPA rules

- 911 funding goes to County
- Examples of ineffectiveness

PSAP – Win-Win-Win Scenario

CCSD will be the PSAP for the county

 Needs facility to accommodate this mandate
 We propose the county buying our PD station as it meets all their needs with only minimal remodeling

APD will relocate to another facility designed to meet current/future needs

The current facility was designed for expediency
 Space is cramped, not maximized

 Citizens of Arkadelphia, Clark County will receive proper dispatching facilities at reasonable costs
